
Over the past year and beyond, the ECYP community—all of us—have experienced tremendous change. The COVID-19 pandemic has changed the way we work, the way we learn and the way we engage with each other. 



Our Work

The Elijah Cummings Youth Program in Israel (ECYP) builds leaders equipped for the future. For two decades, ECYP's vision is a world guided by ambassadors of cross-cultural relations who have high expectations of themselves and are committed to working for a better tomorrow. In 2020 ECYP served 25 fellows in two cohorts who represented the Classes of 2020 and 2021. The fellows participated in virtual leadership training and community service.
